The Topeka Metro's new **Bike Share Program** began April 15th. There are 100 new smart bikes stationed around the city that you can rent for a few hours at a time. Each bike is fitted with a computer and locking system on the back. A year's

It is a violation of federal law for a housing provider to refuse to rent or sell a home, to offer unequal terms, quote different prices, or apply different policies on the basis of race, color, religion, disability, or handicap, sex, familial status, or national origin. State law prohibits discrimination on the basis of marital status, ancestry, age, or familial status. Fair Housing Amendments Act of 1988 bars discrimination in the sale or rental of housing on the basis of a disability or because there are children in the family, but exempts housing for older persons.

Spring Maintenance: Furnace filters should be changed quarterly to ensure that the unit runs efficiently. If you haven't changed filters in the past 3 months, now is a good time to change the filter.

Sewer Back up Issue: Lately, many of our sewer backups have been caused by what the tenants are putting down the toilet. Sewer pipes do not like the following items:

- Baby wipes
- Toilet Wipes (No matter what the box says)
- Tampons (No matter what the box says)
- Q-tips
- Paper towels
- Charmin toilet paper
- Grease

Any of the above items will catch in different areas of the sewer lines and cause a blockage. It can cost the tenant anywhere from \$90 and above to fix this situation. Please do not put any of these items down the toilet, tub or sinks drains.

Bed Bugs, Bed Bugs, Wacha gonna do?: These pesky bugs are still an issue city wide. They can be found in beds, sofas, bedside tables, and picture frames. Bed bugs spread through walls along wire and pipes, and from anything (furniture, backpacks, laundry) coming from an infested property.

Precautions to take: Keep coats, backpacks, purses, and bags off beds, recliners, and sofas. Don't bring home used furniture, even from those you know. Don't take things out of dumpsters. Look for signs of bed bugs before sleeping.

DON'T WAIT!!! If you think you may have bed bugs, call the office and we will have pest control inspect your unit. Pest control treatment for bed bugs is the tenants responsibility. The cost to you to treat will only increase the longer you wait to report it.
